

① 1968 Wedgewood Circle (Carter Residence)

Located in Northwood Lakes off Middle Urbana Road

② 644 N. Wittenberg Avenue (Frandsen Residence)

Located on Wittenberg Campus off North Fountain Avenue

Mike and Sharon Frandsen moved into the Benjamin Prince House in July 2017 when Mike became the 15th president of Wittenberg University. They enjoy entertaining students, faculty, staff, alumni and guests at the house.

Wittenberg professor Isaac Sprecher, nephew of Wittenberg's second President, Samuel Sprecher, had the mansion built between 1857 and 1860 using limestone for the foundation from what is now Veterans' Memorial Park. Sprecher rented the home to Professor Charles Ehrenfeld for a short time and sold the property to Benjamin Prince in 1883. All three of these men were responsible for collecting tuition and fees, so every student visited the house for decades. Benjamin Prince played an important role at Wittenberg serving for 69 years as faculty, business manager and Vice President. You'll find Benjamin Prince's framed photograph and signature in the foyer. After Benjamin Prince's death in 1933, his two daughters continued to live there until 1949 when they sold the property to the university. The large living room and dining room were added in 1955.

Sharon finds it is easy to showcase the school's red and white when decorating for Christmas. The Frandsens' tree holds ornaments they have collected over the years. Most are meaningful because of connections to people and places.

③ 3571 Towerwood Court (Gunnell Residence)

Located in Holiday Hills off Old Columbus Road

Peter & Leta welcome you into their colonial style home this holiday season. The home was built in 1994 by Kristina & Jerry Clum, Jr, founders of Comfort Keepers. Favorite features of the home are the 4+ car garage, the amazing backyard with 40ft salt water pool and waterfalls, hot tub, pool house and the lower level of the home boasting a theater room, billiard & bar room and exercise room. Since purchasing the home in 2016 the Gunnells have replaced flooring, painted, completely transformed the kitchen,

updated the landscaping and most recently added a screened room to the home. Their appreciation for items of the past show throughout the home with antiques collected including many family heirlooms. For the holiday season enter into the home and you will be greeted with a 12 foot Christmas tree accenting the curving stairway to the second floor.
