

① **Corner of E. Main Street and S. Greenmount Avenue**

The Delta T90 Solar House was designed and built by students at Norwich University in Vermont and placed 12th in the 13th Solar Decathlon Competition before being donated to and located on the Westcott Center for Architecture + Design property. The designers' goal of blending energy efficiency, affordability, and aesthetic appeal is evident upon entering the streamlined structure.

The ultramodern kitchen features energy efficient appliances with some open shelving and a horizontal window above the sink for natural light. The adjacent dining and living areas contribute to the open feel of this compact dwelling. A bedroom, bathroom, and utility closet complete the home. From the roof's solar panels to the windows' contemporary wooden slatted shutters everything about this house declares that it belongs to the 21st century.

② **1819 Audubon Park Drive**

Like its illustrated lookalike, the titular *Little House* from Virginia Lee Burton's children's classic, this charming Cape Cod-style at 1819 Audubon Park Drive entered this world in 1942. Its current owners came along in 1986 and have cherished it as home ever since. After years of planning, the entire first floor and exterior of the house were recently renovated, including a new roof, front door, siding, and stone porch and walkway. And yet, the kitchen stands as centerpiece of this recent overhaul, pairing vintage-styled Jadeite green appliances with modern features including white quartz countertops, bead board ceiling and farmhouse sink.

This vintage inspiration is not limited to appliances; a collection of midcentury glassware shines on display in the dining room, where newly-added wainscoting and crown molding continue from the kitchen and into the hallway. Visits to family in South Carolina inspired the haint blue ceiling visible on the screened-in side porch – an eye-catching tradition of the Gullah people dating prior to the American Revolution, originally purported to keep away unwanted spirits! Fortunately, you'll find none of those at 1819 Audubon Park Drive.

③ **2141 Oak Knoll Drive**

As the former residence of Al and Julia Tehan for nearly 45 years, Patrick and Melissa Tehan were honored to keep the home in the family for years to come. Upon walking in the front door past the newly added front porch, you will quickly notice no screw was left unturned during this full interior and exterior remodel. Their renovation began in June 2018 and continued until December of the same year while also welcoming their son Andrew in July 2018. They met with Michael Jones of Michael Jones Designs and decided he shared a similar vision for their project focused on quality. As the contractor on the project, Michael added custom touches as well as guided the owners toward the appropriate choices with the help of Lysa Smith and Laura Maletic.

As you walk in the mahogany front door, you will immediately notice the feel of a brand new home with a touch of modern farmhouse. The kitchen was moved

to the center of the home to allow for an open floor plan between the living and dining rooms. Upon entering the kitchen, you will stand in awe overlooking an 8-1/2 foot kitchen island complete with quartz countertops surrounded by Troyer's Custom Amish Cabinetry and professional stainless appliances. Step past the crystal chandelier into the dining room for a view overlooking the spacious wooded back yard and 14' x 2'5 composite deck recently added. The Tehans hope you enjoy visiting the family home they so lovingly renovated.

④ **430 Leander Drive**

Lori, Mike and their two greyhounds left their home on Brighton Road in 2013 when the beautiful view, woods and stream of Aberfelda Hills called to them. Renovations began immediately throughout this 3 bedroom, 2-1/2 bath, 3600-square-foot home, including hardwood flooring, a massive walk-in closet, master and Jack & Jill bathrooms, family room expansion and of course the kitchen!

Along with opening up the original floor plan, bringing texture, nature and functionality to the kitchen were all key, as there is plenty of cooking, baking and entertaining at the Houseman house! The redesign incorporates both drawers and cabinets with a "furniture" feel, hidden decorative storage like 3" pull out spice racks, granite countertops, double ovens and a single over-sized sink. Every element has a reason behind it, including lowering Lori's main workspace by one inch for a more comfortable baking area. To add to the open feel there are no upper cabinets and for added texture you'll notice a unique range hood brought in from California. ⑤ **4135 Briarwood Drive, Urbana**

Thirty years ago when the Gildeas bought their house they loved the area and the neighborhood. The house was only four year old but needed a lot of work to make it theirs. Now, as Lynda is getting ready to put the house on the market, she reflects on the love and work that has gone into making this house her beautiful home. Every room in the house has been remodeled plus a four season sunroom was added. The kitchen's beautiful cabinets with self-closing deep drawers, hardwood floors, granite counter tops, under counter lighting and California Closets custom designed pantry make it a wonderful work area. In addition, with the adjoining 12' x 25' foot dining room and gathering area, it is ideal for entertaining.

Both of the full bathrooms have marble floors and sheets of marble on the full walls. The shower enclosure in the master bath has marble tile to the ceiling. The three bedrooms are finished out with California Closets. Skylights were installed in the master bedroom, family room and kitchen providing a very light, bright and airy environment. Last but not least the four car garage is every man's dream!
